



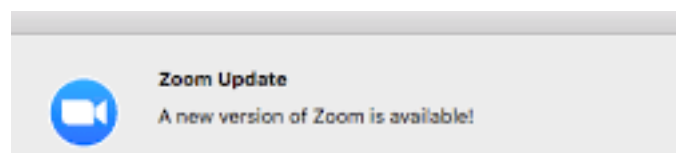
The video conferencing company Zoom has recently learned of unpatched vulnerabilities, or weaknesses, and bugs in their platform that have been causing concerns with users.

Zoom has been actively fixing issues and have just released a bug fix that they are automatically pushing out to users when they use Zoom. But all users will need to accept the update and let it install on their systems.

With massive numbers of people now working from home, many are relying on video conferencing through Zoom to connect with co-workers, customers, and partners. Often people are connecting to sensitive work networks through temporary or improvised
